Brother Dan Kane Creates CD

With Thanksgiving around the corner, Advent and Christmas are right behind. **Brother Dan Kane**, a member of the Congregation of Holy Cross living at Gilmour Academy, has released a CD called “*Sacred Piano Reflections*” created for relaxation, inspiration, and meditative moments just in time for the holidays. It is a collection of 18 favorite hymns including “Amazing Grace,” “Abide With Me,” “O Little Town of Bethlehem,” “Londonderry Air,” and “Away in the Manger.”

Organist, pianist and composer at the Church of St. Dominic in Shaker Heights, Kane explains that his arrangements enhance the hymns because they are supported by harmonies and progressions listeners seldom hear. Melodic fragments and mini-episodes contribute to interest in the reflections.



With a music ministry that spans more than 50 years, Kane previously published two books of hymn arrangements—“*Selectable Delectables*” and a sequel with additional arrangements. He believes sharing inspiring music with others is one way he can glorify God. A graduate of the University of Notre Dame, Kane earned a master’s degree in music from DePaul University in Chicago and did postgraduate work in piano performance at the Cleveland Institute of Music. When he is not creating music and performing, Kane is a home care nurse for the elderly with Benjamin Rose Institute.

St. Joseph High May Build; New Bishop Named

Within four days this past week the Diocese of Fort Wayne - South Bend (Wednesday) gave the green light for a \$35 million dollar, 15-month fundraising effort to begin for a new St. Joseph High School to be located on the present site of St. Joseph Hospital. The hospital will open their new hospital in Mishawka on December 14. On Saturday, the Most Rev. Kevin Rhoades, 51, of Harrisburg, PA was named the new bishop of the Fort Wayne – South Bend diocese replacing the retired Most Rev. John M. D’Arcy, 77. Bishop D’Arcy served as bishop of the Fort Wayne – South Bend diocese for 24 years.

In announcing his decision to allow St. Joseph High School to begin fundraising, Bishop D’Arcy praised the Brothers of Holy Cross along with the Holy Cross priests and Sisters of the Holy Cross for their years of dedication to St. Joseph High School as well as the University of Notre Dame, St. Mary’s College and Holy Cross College.

If the fundraising plan is a success the Midwest Province will have an option to buy the land they sold to St. Joseph High School about 14 years ago. Our last Chapter indicated the wish of the province to buy the land back if it would become available.

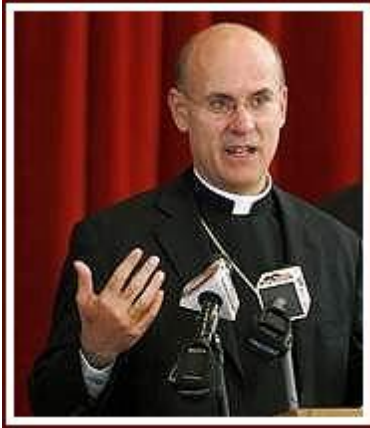

Brother Thomas Maddix Sends Update



At the end of October, I commenced a three-module program for health care leaders in Catholic organizations in Canada. There are three modules (fall, winter and spring) and the courses are held in both Western Canada (Edmonton/Nanaimo, BC) and Eastern Canada (North Bay, ON). There are 31 people enrolled in the Western program and 26 in the Ontario one with two people from New Brunswick. The aim of the program is to help leaders better understand the mission, identity, history and ethical framework of Catholic health care in Canada. Topics touched upon are: spirituality; founding mission of the sisters; canon law; ethics (clinical

and organizational); moral distress and church history. There are also a series of timely articles and books that are part of the course. On Monday the 9th of May, I was part of a program entitled: *Giving Voice: Advocacy and Mental Health*. Hosted by the Health-Law Society of the University of AB at the University of Alberta in Edmonton, I spoke on Organizational Ethics as part of the section entitled: *How Ethics Might Help*.
